As part of our work with the community, we invite The Storytellers from Lidlington Church, into our school. They act out a story from the Bible each week and this is always a popular assembly.

Assembly takes place every morning at 10.25am and involves the whole school. During this time we focus on a Value of the month, and a Feeling. Sometimes we use a story from a Faith to help illustrate that Value. We then sing a song linked to our Values, and end with a moment of quiet reflection.
