Staffing news

I wanted to update you on recent staff changes.

Covid

Following Government guidance we are back to school for all pupils, and will continue to implement the procedures and policies identified in our risk assessments in order to reduce the risk of transmission.

New Behaviour Policy

We continue to follow the highly acclaimed positive behaviour route. In the past we have been asked "Do we ignore poor behaviour?" and "What are our consequences?". We have therefore tweaked our existing model so that you can more clearly see when a consequence has happened, and the incident that led up to it.

Our priority has been to draw up a revised set of Golden Rules and Star Values, which shows those qualities we encourage all children to live. As before, your child will be reminded of these rules, and will be asked to talk about their behaviour if they are showing

negative behaviours. Should they continue to carry on with the behaviour they will lose 5 minutes of their playtime and a note will be sent home explaining that this has happened and making you aware of the incident.

Should any child continue to forget their values, they will then complete a reflection task outside of the classroom, to ensure that they are really thinking about how to improve their behaviour. We feel this is more powerful than a simple "Sorry!" and enables the child to really think about good and bad choices.

If there are 3 notes home in any half term, we will arrange a meeting with you so that a target can be set for your child and we can work with you to help your child be the best they can be.
