Headteacher's Introduction

We have had another fantastic week of learning at TJLS - and the children continue to impress me with their thirst for new learning. My vision for this school is a clear and simple one. I want to ensure that every child leaves our school with every door of opportunity still open to them.

With this in mind, I am clearly focused on leading the school to get even better at what it does. When I have walked around school during these first two weeks, I can feel a real learning buzz in the classrooms. Children are clearly enjoying their learning and are motivated to succeed. Together, as one community, I am determined to create a successful school community with a 'can do' attitude rather than relying on reasons or excuses why we 'can't do' something.

However, it is obvious that the school's role is limited. If a child comes to school every single day for one year, it means they have access to **950 hours** of teaching time - this is **just over 10% of the total hours in a year**. We must work in **partnership with you** to provide the best education possible for your child so they are able not just to survive in the modern world - but <u>thrive</u>.

I know the vast majority of parents/carers share our desire for their child to excel. As a school we really appreciate the contribution of so many parents/carers who read regularly with their child, get them into good independent learning habits, develop self-discipline and encourage their child to meet our shared expectations.

On a daily basis, I see many, many parents modelling our high expectations to their children - not just in terms of learning but in terms of how they behave. This could be through parking considerately outside the school, respectfully speaking to other members of the TJLS community, or the way they deal with any issues that arise. This attitude makes the TJLS community a very special place to belong to.

I also know our shared determination means we will not lower our expectations of the children. Most children - and perhaps most adults - don't like it when things get harder or expectations rise - but at TJLS we are beginning to learn about developing a *Growth Mindset* where we believe we can learn from failure and embrace challenges instead of shying away from them. By helping us to transmit this attitude to your children you are giving them the very best chance for their future.

I am pleased with the start we have made to the new academic year - and with your continued support we can build on these early few weeks and make this a year to remember at TJLS!

The introduction of Houses - and the search for House Captains...

To further develop our understanding of community, belonging and teamwork - we have decided to introduce a House Point system in school. All children will be a member of one of the four school houses - with all siblings being in the same house as each other.

Children will be awarded House Points for showing brilliant behaviour, exceptional effort and legendary learning on a day-to-day basis. They will collect House Points both as a team and individually. When children earn 20 House Points they will be awarded with a Bronze Award, 40 points for a Silver Award and 60 points for a Gold Award.

Each half-term, the House with the most points will be awarded the TJLS House Cup - and will earn a House Reward. At the end of the year, the winning House will be awarded with the first ever TJLS House Award. House Points will start to be collected in the coming weeks.

Today, children have been assigned to their Houses - and you will find their House Membership Certificate in their book bags.

But before we can do anything, we need to assign two House Captains for each house.

All <u>Year 4 children</u> are eligible to apply for the role of becoming a House Captain. Their role is to be highly upstanding role models within the TJLS Community and be responsible for collecting, counting and communicating the number of House Points earned back to me.

It is a big job - but I know the Year 4 children are up to it!

To apply for these positions, Year 4 children have been asked to create a one-minute presentation explaining why they want to be a House Captain and why they would be fantastic in the role.

Children will be called to present their speech on **Tuesday 27th September** and we will announce the successful House Captains in assembly on Friday 30th September.
