We are a nut free school

People who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe and potentially life-threatening allergic reaction. If someone has a nut allergy, it is not just from eating nuts that can cause reaction. Just by being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has eaten nuts, or a product containing nuts, can trigger an allergic reaction.

For this reason, I must insist we are a nut-free school - and children should not have nuts in school in any form.

Reading at home

The children's reading record books are designed to track the progress they make with their reading. Every time you hear your child read - please take a few moments to indicate this in their reading record. It helps the class teachers to understand how regularly children are reading - and which children can be identified as requiring some extra reading time in school.

Did you know, research shows children who read aloud every day acquire new language and vocabulary <u>up to ten</u> times faster than children who read aloud only once a week?
