# Phonics information session

We are inviting parents and carers of Preschool, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children to attend an information session exploring phonics. This will be led by Miss Turner. We will look at what phonics is, how we teach it in school, and how you can help at home. This session will take place, as already scheduled, on Thursday 24th November at 2pm in the main hall. We anticipate the session to last for around 30-40 minutes. We ask that you enter and exit the hall from the external door by the patio area. If you cannot attend, don't worry. # 'The 48 Hour Rule'

Winter has truly arrived - and that means many children and adults can become more susceptible to sickness at this time of year. From time to time children are sick (*vomit*) either at home or at school. Unfortunately, it is not possible to distinguish between the causes, and therefore it is essential that the same rule of absence applies in <u>all</u> cases of vomiting and/or diarrhoea.

Diarrhoea and/or vomiting commonly affects children and adults and can be caused by a number of different germs, including viruses, parasites and bacteria. Infections can be easily spread from person to person (*most commonly by unwashed hands*), especially in children. This is why we will be reminding everyone of the importance of handwashing.

Government guidance from Public Health England state that any staff member or child with diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms must stay away from the school or early years setting until they have been **free of symptoms for 48 hours** ('the 48 hour rule') and feel well. Personal hygiene whilst ill must be very strict.

If your child is sick at school, we will ask you or your emergency contact to take your child home. They should not return for 48 hours to the school premises. We appreciate this can be inconvenient in some cases, and you may not believe your child is ill, but you will appreciate that we do this in all cases and it is to reduce the risk of infection for all children and staff in school.

As an example, if your child is sick at lunchtime on a Tuesday, they should not return to school until after lunch on Thursday, provided there have not been any further episodes of vomiting and/or diarrhoea.
