#### Welcome

#### Scarlet Fever and Group Strep A Infections

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) are closely monitoring the increased cases of Group A Streptococcus (Strep A) and Scarlet Fever. The UKHSA have said there is no evidence that a new strain is circulating and the increase is most likely related to high amounts of circulating bacteria and social mixing.

To prevent the spread of Strep A, UKHSA advises children, young people and adults to implement good hand and respiratory hygiene practices. We will increase our already high expectation of this in school.

#### Free Schools Meals

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free school meals, referred to as Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM).

Any child in Reception through to Year 11 that meets the government criteria is entitled to benefits based free school meals.

A citizen portal is available to help you find out if your child qualifies for free school meals. The system is quick and simple to use and <u>can be accessed by clicking here</u>.

#### Uniform

Wearing uniform is to encourage children to look smart and feel smart for their learning. At TJLS we believe children should feel a sense of pride in being a member of our school community. This is reflected in the pride they show when wearing our school uniform.

Our uniform list is as follows:

- Grey trousers, skirt, pinafore dress or shorts.
- White polo shirt, buttoned shirt or blouse.
- Green checked school dress as a summer alternative.
- Bottle green jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan.
- Black, white or grey socks.
- Black, white or grey tights.
- Black flat-heeled school shoes (*not trainers, canvas, fabric or open-toed*) with buckles, Velcro or laces that your child can take on and off independently.
- Black, green or white hair bands and hair bobbles.
- Bottle green book bag

For PE, our uniform is as follows:

- Black or bottle green shorts
- White or bottle green t-shirt
- Dark coloured trainers
- Black or green tracksuit trousers
- Black or green jumper

If children have pierced ears, then they must only wear studs (*no hoops or dangly earrings of any kind*) - and they must be covered for PE.

We do not permit children to have extreme haircuts or colouring that could serve as a distraction to other children or themselves.

#### Please make sure that all uniform and PE kit is clearly named to ensure swift return should they become lost.
