Headteacher's Introduction

Today has been a fantastic celebration of reading, stories and books across school. Just some of the exciting things children have got up to today include:

- In Pre-School and Reception, children have read the traditional story of The Gingerbread Man and even made their own gingerbread! Yummy! The children had a taste once it was cooled and used a variety of adjectives to describe the taste.
- In Year 1, children made their own cut out shadow puppets and used them to perform a story in front of an audience.
- In Year 2, children have been creating book covers and blurbs, making their own bookmarks and finding hidden books as part of a treasure hunt.
- In Year 3, children have made posters describing their favourite book characters.
- In Year 4, children listened to an author speak online and then had a masterclass for how to draw characters from a book. They also played a book character guessing game where they had to use their deduction skills and then looked for clues as part of a literature scavenger hunt.

It was excellent to see so many children dressed as a book character, or in their pyjamas or their own clothes today. We had a variety of children's characters make an appearance today including: lots of Where's Wally and Wendas, Harry Potter characters, superheroes, fairy tale characters, and animals - to name but a few...!

After you have dropped children off from the main playground, please make your way around to the patio by the external hall door and we will open up the hall for you.

Progress Consultations

You should have received your appointment time by now - but if not, please contact your child's class teacher. These meetings are essential in ensuring that we (*school and home*) are effectively supporting your child and targeting the same areas of development. We do expect all parents/carers to attend a consultation meeting.

The purpose of the meeting is to give you an opportunity to discuss how your child is progressing with their learning and to share any other key information. Meetings will be strictly kept to a maximum of 9 minutes as we must ensure we start each meeting on time.

- Please remember to arrive at least 5 minutes before the appointment to help us keep on time,
- Please enter and exit the school via the external hall door (from the patio outside of Hedgehog's drop off point),
- In the hall there will be tables set up with children's books on. You are welcome to browse through your child's learning but please do not take the books home with you,
- Your child's class teacher will collect you from the hall at your appointment time,
- all appointments will last no longer than 9 minutes,
- the appointment must focus on children's learning (*if you have any other concerns then a separate meeting can be scheduled for another day*),
- Dusk Until Dawn will be positioned in Hedgehogs on both progress consultation evenings so please collect children from the door by Hedgehogs classroom.

We look forward to welcoming you into school.

Online Safety - Roblox

Roblox - updated PEGI rating

PEGI have announced a change to the age rating for Roblox. PEGI used to rate Roblox as 7+. However due to the huge level of user generated content within Roblox, PEGI have changed the rating to a Parental Guidance label (icon shown right).

What is Roblox?

You can either use Roblox to create games or play games that other users have created. As a lot of the content is user generated, it may mean not all games will be suitable for your child to view/play. It is important to set up Parental controls appropriate to your child.

Allowed Experiences

NEW Roblox has introduced Allowed Experiences, which allows you to select ageappropriate experiences, so your child can only join experiences that match their age set. Please note that experiences above the age restriction set may be seen in search results. Age categories available are 9+, 13+ and all ages.

What should I be aware of?

- Chat Facility Players can chat to each other on Roblox. You can add parental controls to turn this feature off completely or add restrictions.
- Virtual Currency Players can buy Robux (their virtual currency) to buy in-game upgrades or accessories. If you do not want your child to purchase them, then ensure you set the Monthly Spend Restriction to zero.
- Game content as mentioned, games are created by different users so sometimes the content may not be appropriate for your child.
- Blocking users and reporting ensure your child knows how to do this.

What should I do?

- Play the game with your child.
- Explore the parental controls within Roblox and set as appropriate.
- Show your child how to use the Report Abuse system within Roblox to report inappropriate content and how to block other users.
