General reminders

- Please remember that all bikes and scooters should be left at the front of the school in the designated area by the front gate. If you do choose to leave a bike or scooter on school premises, then please remember to take it home at the end of the day.
- If your child is having a packed lunch, please remember we are a healthy eating school and encourage the children to eat a balanced diet. A lunchbox full of treats is not for a school day.
- If your child does not have a school dinner, please remember that these are <u>free for all children in</u> <u>Reception, Year 1 and Year 2</u> - and they are absolutely delicious. Picky eaters will be more likely to try unfamiliar foods if they see their friends eating it, so please do consider giving it a try. We are so lucky to have freshly cooked nutritious food prepared onsite by our fabulous kitchen team.
- For children in Pre-School, Year 3 and Year 4 the price of a meal is currently £2.30 and will increase to £2.50 from April 1st as a response to the rising cost of ingredients.

Late arrival and late collection

If, with your children, you are late arriving at the start of the day - or late collecting at the end of the day - then you must sign your child in/out using the late book at main reception.

You may not think one or two minutes matters very much - but persistent late arrival and/or late collection is a safeguarding matter and can be subject to legal action. Did you know arriving and collecting from school on time is a parent/carer's legal duty?

Science Week - 13th to 17th March

Next week is British Science Week and this year's theme is Connections.

In class over the course of the week, children will design a poster to enter a national competition related to:

- How our body parts are connected
- Connections between actions and the impact on the environment
- Connections in the eco-system including food chains, life cycles etc.

Each school is eligible to enter a maximum of 5 posters into the competition - so at the end of the week we will choose one poster from each class to enter.

All children in all classes will also take part in live online lessons hosted by the NFU (National Farmers' Union) over the course of the week.

The Great British Spring Clean

This is taking place between 17th March and 2nd April. Last year, 260,000 schoolchildren took part. Our Eco-Committee is encouraging all of the children at TJLS to pledge to take part this year and help make that number even bigger.



This year Keep Britain Tidy will be focusing on the pride our young #LitterHeroes have for their school and local community.

Did you know 82% of children and young people aged 6 to 17 believe they are capable of making a positive difference to the future of the planet, but more than two thirds say they need others to hep them, according to a YouGov poll conducted on behalf of Keep Britain Tidy?

By empowering our children to take part, you will be supporting them to make a difference to the planet.
