Car Parking

This is a polite reminder that the car park at the front of school is not a public car park - and should only be used by staff at the start and end of the school day.

There is a disabled parking bay at the front of school that can be used by parents/carers provided they have a blue disabled badge clearly displayed in their window.

Please refrain from parking outside the school gates at the end of Hurst Grove. This area is clearly marked with yellow zig zags and no vehicles should be parked there at any time for any reason.

If you have no option but to drive to school, then I would encourage you to park a little further out and walk the last little bit of the journey.

Our Eco-Committee have identified parking outside the school as an issue and they are exploring how to support the local community to be able to use their vehicles in a more environmentally friendly way and to ensure no accidents occur.

Notifying the school of a child's absence

Chains of communication

Communication is extremely important to us in helping to support your child. The following protocol ensures that <u>all parents/carers</u> follow the same process:

Your first point of contact is <u>always</u> the class teacher.	They are the adults who are working closely on a daily basis with your child and any concerns you may have can often be quickly resolved. This can generally be done at the end of the school day. Should you require more time then please make an appointment to see your child's teacher via the main office. Please be mindful that teachers may have prearranged meetings straight after school during the week.
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If for some reason the issue has not been resolved please make an appointment to see our Senior Teacher.	Miss Turner is our Senior Teacher.
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In the unlikely event it still cannot be resolved please make an appointment to see the Headteacher.	Mr Bolger is our Headteacher.
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In the unlikely event it still cannot be resolved then you will be directed to our Chair of Governors.	Mr Mason is our Chair of Governors.

In 2022, the NSPCC reported that over half of children in the UK regularly watch online and TV content that is inappropriate for their age.

<u>Common Sense Media</u>. This provides age-based media reviews for families and features trusted ratings and reviews for what your children are into (*before they get into it*), across all aspects of online content.
