Headteacher's Introduction

Welcome back to the Summer term here at TJLS. I was hoping to see a flourish of sunny, warm weather for the arrival of the new term - and I am hopeful this arrives soon!

On Monday 17th April, we were closed for an INSET Day. This is used as staff training. We had an excellent day together as a staff looking at how we can develop the teaching of maths across the school. We spent a good amount of time talking about the mindset and attitude people usually have towards maths. When we say things like "I'm not a maths person", we are accidentally communicating to children that we feel we don't have to learn maths or try hard with maths. After all, we wouldn't say "I'm not a person who reads" - and maths should be no different.

As a father of three, including two daughters, I am very interested in how society, schools and businesses phrase the importance of learning maths to girls.

28% of the world's scientific researchers are women - and only 14% of women chose science-related fields when entering higher education in the UK, compared to 39% of men. This tells us that women are vastly underrepresented in the world of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM). This is partly due to gender-stereotypes and the attitude of society.

This is why at TJLS we believe everyone can be a maths person.

In fact, it is crucial for the future of our society that girls and women are provided with equal opportunity to fully develop 21st century competencies. Equipped with these competencies, girls and women can take part in STEMrelated fields and be enabled to contribute to the development of the world as equal, empowered, confident, proactive and responsible citizens.
