Chicks and Ducks

This week we have been very lucky to welcome some small visitors to school! We have had two groups of eggs delivered to school - one group of chicks and one group of ducklings. The children (*and adults*) have enjoyed seeing the young hatchlings emerge from their eggs.

As I write this letter, a small number of eggs continue to be incubated and we are waiting for them to hatch. When they have all fully hatched, each class will have the opportunity to handle, observe and care for the animals. This is an exciting time in school because children find this experience fascinating, exciting and relaxing. It is also an important developmental step to learn how to care for animals and to observe the stages of new life in different animals.

Canal and River Trust Visit

This week, we welcomed Mike and Stuart from the Canal and River Trust to talk to the children about how to behave safely around water and what to do in an emergency. They taught us their special rule: **SAFE** - **Stay Away From the Edge.** We have arranged for them to come back later in the term to speak in slightly more detail with our older children.

Marston Vale Community Rail Partnership - Steam Engine

We were hoping on Wednesday this week to have seen a vintage steam train pass through the village but it was unfortunately cancelled. I am told the brakes failed before it even departed from London. It was disappointing but learning to be disappointed and to deal with the emotions it brings is a valuable life lesson. I was very impressed by the resilience the children showed. We tried to 'make up' for it as best we could by showing the children videos of steam trains and talking about our different experiences of trains and railways.

As part of our Year of Inspiration, and to 'make up' for it even more, I have now arranged for the rail transport manager at MVCRP to visit the school with the British Transport Police and also Network Rail to educate our children about rail safety.

With the tracks running straight through the village, it is absolutely crucial that young Lidlington villagers are educated about the dangers and precautions of railway tracks.



Extra-Curricular Clubs

If, for some reason, your child needs to attend a medical appointment during the school day, please let the office know beforehand of this planned absence so it can be correctly marked on the register.

Please be reminded that we cannot authorise any holidays during term time. Absences will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances - and a holiday is not classed as exceptional.

Any of leave of absence must be requested by filling out the relevant form.
