This week, as part of our Year of Inspiration, we were excited and delighted to welcome **Chris Rattenbury** from a charitable organisation called Wheelpower.

Wheelpower's mission is to provide, promote and develop opportunities for wheelchair users to move more, play sport and be physically active. They are based at Stoke Mandeville, the home of the Paralympics, and work to raise awareness of disability sport. Chris is a volunteer for Wheelpower - and has worked with the organisation for over a decade since finishing his own sporting career. In 2013, he was ranked 3rd in the world for disabled powerlifting.

He talked to the children about how different sports can be made accessible for wheelchair users - and he explained how the first Paralympic Games was devised. - Eagle Class - Year 4 - Mrs Blythe

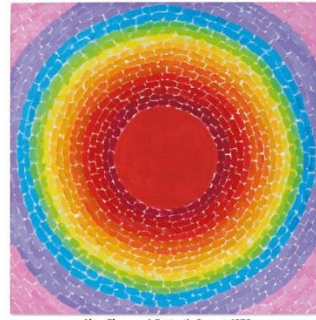
Art Week

Faith is well known for her narrative quilts.



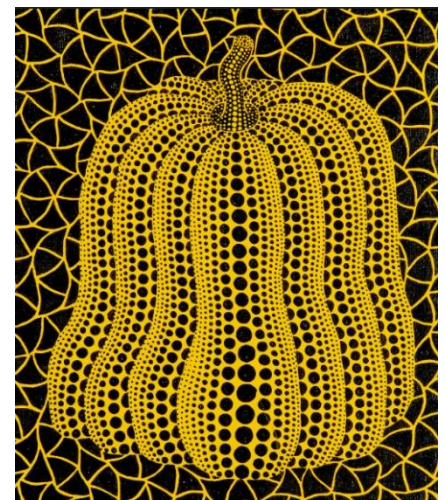
Takashi Murakami
