Adjustment to the school day

Our school gates will continue to open at 8.40am.

- During this time, children are to be supervised at all times by their parents and carers.
- The play trail, pirate ship and field are all out of bounds during this time.
- Children must not take part in any <u>rough play</u> within the school site.

The doors will open and the school day will begin at 8.50am.

- Children in Year 1-4 will continue to come into school via the ramp.
- Children in Pre-School and Reception will enter via the door off the patio area or the hall door if not fully repaired.
- Registers will open at 8.50am.
- We appreciate that some families need to drop children off at both doors please don't worry, we will
 wait for you.

The aim of our curriculum is to open doors of opportunity for our children



The doors will now <u>close at 8.55am</u>.

- Almost every day, every child is in school by this time.
- Because of the number of children we have on roll, there is no reason for the door to be kept open any longer.
- The register will be taken promptly at 8.55am.

Latecomers will need to sign in at the front office.

- Any child arriving after 8.55am will need to be signed in at the front office and a reason provided for the lateness.
- They will receive a late mark in the register.
- Any child arriving after 9.15am will need signing in as above and will receive an unauthorised absence mark in the register.
- 10 unauthorised absences in any 12-week period will be referred to the local authority and a fixed penalty notice will be issued.

The school day starts at 8.50am and ends at 3.20pm. This is 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours per day and 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours per week.

Attendance

A very special well done to Esme (Rec), Emily (Y2), Sophia (Y2) and Jaydn (Y4) for achieving an attendance rate of <u>100%</u> this academic year!

A very special well done to <u>Jaydn in Year 4</u> - who has achieved an attendance rate of <u>100% for the past 3 years</u> <u>running</u>! In fact, he has only had 2½ days off in 5 years whilst at TJLS - meaning his overall attendance since Reception is <u>99.7%</u>. What an amazing achievement!

Well done to Year 3 for leading the way and having the best overall attendance this year!

Attendance at school is not only a legal requirement but also has a huge impact on the attainment and progress of children. We will be developing a revised approach to attendance in the autumn term.


Attendance really does impact on children's overall progress and achievement. The most recent UK data shows that children with the highest attainment at the end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6 SATs) and Key Stage 4 (Year 11 GCSEs) have higher rates of attendance over the key stage compared to those with the lowest attainment.

The average attendance rate of a child meeting at least the expected standard in reading, writing and maths at KS2 (Y6 SATs) is 96.5%.

Whilst the average attendance of a child not meeting the same standards is 95.3%.

Recent research and data show anything less than this can drastically impact on a child's overall level of attainment in their Year 6 SATs and Year 11 GCSEs.

A Year to Remember ...

59% of Reception children achieved the age related expectation. (<u>In line</u> with the national average) 94% of Year 1 children achieved the age related expectation in the Phonics Screening Check. (<u>Significantly</u> <u>above</u> the national average) 100% of Year 2 children achieved the age related expectation in the Phonics Screening Check. (<u>Significantly</u> <u>above</u> the national average) 47% of Year 4 children scored 100% on the Multiplication Times Table Check (<u>Significantly above</u> the national average)

The average score of our Year 4 children in the Multiplication Times Table Check was **20**. (<u>In line</u> with the national average) 73% of Year 2 children achieved the age related expectation in **Reading**. (<u>Above</u> the national average) 73% of Year 2 children achieved the age related expectation in Writing. (<u>Significantly above</u> the national average)

91% of Year 2 children achieved the age related expectation in **Maths**. (<u>Significantly above</u> the national average)
